Summary:

3/6 – Rimrock Walmart – One male attempted to steal items, fled on foot to American Furniture where he had a seizure, GJFD responded and transported him to St. Mary's where he later passed away.

3/7 – 3220 Reeder Mesa Road/William Jarvis Shooting Range - 60 year old male was hit in the face when his weapon blew up while shooting, patient was transported C2 with head laceration and minor bleeding.

3/12 – 1217 Colorado Avenue - Felmen – suspect with a knife threatened and chased RP then fled and barricaded himself in his residence, SWAT was paged after 2 hours and deployed gas in to the home after 4 hours, suspect came out shortly after and was taken in to custody.

3/13 – 2686 B ¾ Road – 85 year old male burning weeds, fell and broke his leg and burned to death, neighbors called in to report after they saw him lying in the backyard next to the propane tank; 2555 C ¾ Road – intoxicated female running around naked, arrested for extreme intoxication and prostitution; Redlands Parkway/Rio Linda Lane – one vehicle rollover, one patient ejected and

transported C2 to St. Mary's; 415 ½ 29 ½ Road – large party, 12 shots fired and blood found on the ground, 15 year old female left home alone while father was out of town, suspects left address and went to another party in the Clifton area, one intoxicated juvenile male was transported to St. Mary's C2 from the 29 ½ Rd residence; Several attempted suicides – 16 year old huffed bug spray, 15 year old female tried to hang herself, 14 year old male huffed body spray, 49 year old female threatened suicide by vehicle.

3/14 – 12th Street/Texas Ave – Party with around 100 people, fight broke out and 2 people were tased, MCSO and CSP backup was requested, took quite a while to get scene under control.

3/15 – I70/Mile Marker 39 – road rage incident with one vehicle rolling over, one patient ejected and another was trapped, both transported to St. Mary's.

3/17 – Street Crimes pursued a C6 subject and stolen vehicle from 28 ½ Road to Candlewood Trailer Park, one male taken in to custody; 2576 Patterson Road – Full structure fire, C5 female set her home on fire, refused commands from Officers to stay away from the house, female was eventually detained, 3 pets were left inside the home.

3/25 – 25 Road/Highway 6 & 50 – vehicle vs. motorcycle, female rider of the motorcycle was transported to St. Mary's with life threatening injuries.

3/26 – Brownie Circle – vehicle vs. kid on bike, kid was not transported; 485 Rambling Acres – 80 year old male passed out while getting in to his vehicle, male fell out of the car and it rolled in to the neighbor's house, male had head lacerations and was transported C2 to St. Mary's.

3/28 – 725 Silverplume Drive – Fruita PD responded to an unattended death of a 16 year old male, unknown cause or circumstances.

3/29 – Mobile fight started at Albertsons on Broadway, female had an open line on her cell phone, tracked her through ALI updates from the Redlands to G & 24 Roads, Patterson & 29 Roads, south to Riverside Parkway where the vehicle was stopped and one male was taken in to custody; 3408 ½ G Road – Motorhome fire, fully involved, Clifton FD responded and no one was injured; 3048 Wedgewood – GJPD observed and followed a C6 subject, taken in to custody after a short foot pursuit.

3/5/2015 2015-00034 Citizen complained that an officer did an improper pat down search of her.
Employee 1 Exonerated *The search was conducted per policy and training.*

3/10/2015 2015-00035 Citizen reported a GJPD officer was speeding in a marked GJPD vehicle on I-70 in the Denver area.
Employee 1 Sustained *Officer counseled reference their driving and an entry made in their employee tracking log.*

3/14/2015 2015-00036 Citizen complained that an officer was rude to him during a contact.
Employee 1 Unfounded *Employee acted appropriately.*

Firearms discharge

3/16/2015 2015-00039 Officer used a firearm to kill an injured deer.
Employee 1 Followed policy *Officer followed policy.*

Traffic accident

3/15/2015 2015-00037 Careless driver ran into a parked, occupied patrol car that had its emergency lights on at an accident scene.
Employee 1 Non-Preventable *No fault on the part of the employee.*

3/16/2015 2015-00038 Employee struck a pole while backing up in a department vehicle, causing minor damage.
Employee 1 Preventable *Employee needs to be more careful when backing.*

Use of force

3/12/2015 2015-00041 Suspect refused to comply with lawful arrest and attempted to flee back into residence. Less lethal rounds (40 mm exact impact munitions sponge rounds) were fired at suspect, striking him in the leg. This slowed him down but did not stop him from re-entering the residence. He complied a short time later and was taken into custody.

Employee 1 Followed policy *This use of force was within policy and objectively reasonable.*

3/27/2015 2015-00042 Suspect fled on foot when told he was under arrest. After a short foot chase, officer deployed a Taser, gained control over the suspect, and took him into custody.

Employee 1 Followed policy *The use of force followed training and policy.*

Vehicle pursuit review

3/15/2015 2015-00040 Officer attempted to get a DV suspect to stop. Suspect failed to yield immediately. Review determined the incident did not meet all the elements of a pursuit.

Employee 1 Followed policy *This incident did not meet the definition of a pursuit.*

Outside Commendation

Outside commendation

3/16/2015 2015-00030 Citizen called the Citizen Comment line to compliment an officer who investigated a traffic accident, saying the officer was "wonderful", "kind", and we should "be proud of how she operates."

Employee 1 Commend employee *Great way to represent our department.*

3/16/2015 2015-00032 Citizen wrote a letter to the Chief complimenting the professionalism and caring attitude of an officer.

Employee 1 None *Great example for a GJPD officer.*

3/27/2015 2015-00043 Citizen called the Comment line after being stopped by an officer to compliment them. He was impressed that the officer was genuinely concerned about him and he wanted us to know how great this officer is.
