Summary:

4/3 – 3242 D ¼ Road #2 – Neighbor dispute, one male was stabbed in the head; 688 29 ½ Road – Male DOA from self-inflicted gunshot wound.

4/4 – 43285 Highway 65/Plateau Canyon – two motorcycle crash, one DOA, one patient transported with a neck injury, a second transported with a broken wrist, MCSO, PVFD and CareFlight responded; 3247 ½ Rood Court #1 – 31 year old male found DOA after committing suicide by hanging.

4/7 – Cold Stone/Highway 6 & 50 – 60 year old female attacked by two dogs that jumped out of a truck bed, multiple wounds; 1267 N 15th Street – male shot another male, the bullet only hit the victim's coat, subject was believed to be barricaded, SWAT was called out and did not find anyone inside the residence.

4/10 – 3025 Highway 50 – unknown male attempted breaking in to a residence, the female occupant and her daughter fought with him and threatened him with a gun and he left; ALERT2 – an airplane with 50 people on board had smoke in the cabin, plane landed safely without incident; Highway 65/Old Grand Mesa Road – one vehicle rollover and caught on fire, no injuries; I70-Exit 42 – one vehicle

rollover, one patient ejected and was transported via Palisade Fire with Clifton ALS.

4/20 – Two year old female was taken to St. Mary's after ingesting an "unknown white powder substance", RP (the mother) later revealed her roommate is known to use drugs including ecstasy and cocaine, unknown which was ingested.

4/25 – 557 W Pabor Ave #4 – male subject got into female's truck at City Market and threatened her with a gun, told her to take him to her residence, once they arrived the female's husband shot the subject and called law enforcement, subject died from gunshot wound; 2615 Patterson – intoxicated male called to report missing 2 year old son, had not seen him for approximately 30 minutes, GJPD officers later found the boy sleeping in the RP's vehicle, RP was taken in to custody; 2915 Orchard Avenue – female was riding her bike by the address, a male subject tried to grab her and assault her, shot her in the face with a BB gun as she ran away, male was taken in to custody.

Citizen Complaint

Code of Conduct violation

4/1/2015 2015-00044 Citizen complained that an officer was harassing his sister by waiting near her house for her to drive by, then issuing her a ticket for no valid driver's license.

Employee 1 Unfounded *There was no act of harassment.*

4/1/2015 2015-00045 Citizen claimed an officer did not have the right to grab her during a lawful detention.

Employee 1 Exonerated *Officer was patient and professional and acted in accordance with policy.*

4/10/2015 2015-00067 Citizen called to complain that an employee made her "feel stupid" and asked like she was a 'nutcase". She said they asked her if she had a "legal guardian" and what "group home" she lived in.

Employee 1 Unfounded *Review of the telephone recording showed that the employee did none of the things alleged.*

4/15/2015 2015-00056 Citizen expressed concern over possible violation of our policy on disseminating confidential information.

Employee 1 Exonerated *Employee acted appropriately and did not violate any policy.*

4/23/2015 2015-00059 Citizen reported that on two occasions an unknown officer harassed her by driving past her and shining a light at her car.

Employee 1 Unsustained *Unable to identify the employee or show the described events occurred.*

4/29/2015 2015-00062 Citizen complained that they were treated poorly when officers arrested her for DUID.

Employee 1-2 Unfounded *There is no credibility to the complaint.*

4/30/2015 2015-00063 Citizen complained that an officer was rude to him and did not know the ADA law as it related to service animals not requiring paperwork to be provided.

Employee 1 Unsustained *Not able to prove officer was or was not rude, only have the citizen's statement.*

Employee 2 Sustained *Sustained as to not knowing the ADA law initially. Not able to prove officer was or was not rude, only have the citizen's statement.*
