The agenda for the meeting had been set during the previous undocumented (no minutes) meeting of the Committee, Tuesday, April 9th at Capers. Our intention as a committee at that time was to have each member gather a list of potential Ridges' covenant violations or possible city code violations and photograph those individual items in question. Then review these possible problems as a Committee and determine actual real problems, a "wish list". This action was the result of a previous luncheon meeting held at City Hall, last year in the presence of Assistant City Attorney, John Shaver and Ivy Willliams, City Code Enforcement Supervisor, among others. The RACC is trying to assemble a prioritized list of concerns, which may require further action and support by the City to remedy. [See RACC Meeting Minutes, Aug. 7, 2001.]

Only two members presented items for the list and only one set of photographs was available at the meeting. The Committee agreed to postpone assemblage of these concerns until the next meeting, set for May 21, 2002.

Robert Anderson made a recommendation to hold RACC meetings at the City Hall in the future. Discussion of the option left it in favor, if not monthly at least, quarterly or when issues required a more dignified venue. Working professionals on the Committee may not always be able to meet at City Hall.
