POLICEMEN'S PENSION BOARD MEETING September 10, 1942 4:30 P.M.

A meeting of the Policemen's Pension Board was held at 4:30 P.M. September 10, 1942 in the office of the City Manager.

Present: Bruce Brownson, President; Francis I. Stringer, Treasurer; Helen C. Tomlinson; H. M. Patterson.

H. M. Patterson was elected Secretary.

Lt. Albert Frazier made application for temporary disability and the following statement was read before the Board by Bruce Brownson:

"To Whom It May Concern:

This is to state that Mr. Albert Frazier of the local Police Department has been under my professional care at intervals during the past eight or nine years, and that during those intervals he has suffered with duodenal ulcer and gall stones.

Several years ago he had the gall bladder removed and at the same operation had performed an operation on his stomach for the treatment of the stomach ulcer. Since the operation, he has had recurrent periods of symptoms which are due to the formation of a new ulcer.

While this condition of ulcer of the stomach could not be stated definitely to be caused by his work, it can be stated that the shift which he had to work had a great deal to due in causing the recurring symptoms of the ulder of the stomach. This condition of ulcer of the stomach is generally a recurrent condition and its recurrence is due to some dietary indiscretion together with other factors.

I cannot state at the present whether his condition will be a permanent disability or not, as so much depends upon the proper hygienic and dietary care together with a more healthful way of living in order to keep his ulcer healed.

After hearing this statement read and discussing the provisions of Section 524, Chapter 163, CSA, relating to Pensions -Temporary and Permanent Disability -death - beneficiaries, the following motion was unanimously passed: That

Lt. Albert Frazier be granted temporary disability beginning September 1, 1942, and continuing for a period of not more than one year or until such time that it can be definitely established that his disability is of a permanent nature or he is able to resume his regular duties. It was further discussed and agreed upon that the Policemen's Cash Pension Fund be permitted to purchase a \$5000.00 U. S. War Savings Bond for the sum of \$3750.00 as an investment and a patriotic gesture.
