

POLICEMEN'S PENSION BOARD MEETING

December 29, 1944

A meeting of the Policemen's Pension Board was held at 1:00.P.M. December 29, 1944 in the office of the City Manager.

Present; Bruce Brownson, President; Francis I. Stringer, Treasurer; H. M. Patterson; Secretary; Helen C. Tomlinson.

Mr Albert Frazier made application for temporary disability and the following statement was read before the Board by Bruce Brownson;

"To whom it may concern;

Mr. Albert Frazier is temporarily disabled because of a tumor of the right kidney and enlargement of the prostate. Both conditions are probably correctable. Prognosis Good to Fair.

After hearing this statement read and discussing the provisions of Section 524, Chapter 163, CSA, relation to Pensions Temporary and Permanent Disability death beneficiaries, the following motion was unanimously passed that

Lt Albert Frazier be granted temporary disability beginning December 21 1944 and continuing for a period of not more than one year or until such time that it can be definitely established that his disability is of a permanent nature or he is able to resume his regular duties.

It was further discussed and agreed upon that Bruce Brownson have the City Attorney get a decision from the Attorney General office as to whether the Board can grant to a member of the Police Dept, compensation from the Police Pension fund where he becomes sick or if service connection half to be proven.
