

March 18, 1966

The Police Pension Board met in the Conference Room at the City Hall at 11:00 o'clock A. M. on Friday, March 18th to further consider retirement for John M. Hooker, Captain, Police Department. City Manager Joe M. Lacy, Chairman of the Board; Carl A. Davis, Representative of the Police Employees; and Helen C. Tomlinson, City Clerk, and Secretary of the Board were present.

The Board had requested that Mr. Hooker be examined by a Physician of the Board's choice and he had therefore undergone a complete physical by Dr. G. Paul Smith. Dr. Smith's report was read. In this report he stated that he did not recommend that Captain Hooker return to his previous occupation as a police officer. He stated that he suffers from angina pectoris and hypertension; shows evidence of cardia enlargement and coronary insufficiency; that he is overweight and has a history of ulcerous disease.

It was moved by Carl Davis and seconded by Helen Tomlinson that Captain John M. Hooker be placed on disability pension of one-half of the salary he is receiving, \$273.00 per month. Motion carried with the provision that if at any time Mr. Hooker's health becomes improved to the point that he can resume a position with as much physical and mental stress as the Police Officer position requires, the Police Pension Board may require that he be re-examined to determine whether or not he is physically disabled so that he cannot perform the duties of Captain of the Police Department.
