The Police Pension Board met in the Conference Room at the City Hall at 4:15 p.m. on Friday, November 25, 1966. City Manager, Richard N. Gray, Chairman of the Board; Carl A. Davis, Representative of the Police Employees; Wm. Manchester, Finance Director, and Helen Tomlinson, City Clerk, and Secretary of the Board were present.

It was reported that Captain John M. Hooker had passed away on November 24th. Captain Hooker had been on disability retirement because of a heart ailment since April 1, 1966.

It was moved by Captain Davis and Seconded by Wm. Manchester that Captain Hooker's widow, Agnes Alice Hooker, be paid her widow's share of police pension. This would be 1/4 of the pay which Captain Hooker was receiving at the time of his retirement on disability, or \$136.50 per month. There are no children in the Hooker family under the age of 16 years. Mrs. Hooker will start receiving pension as of November 24, 1966.
