

POLICE PENSION BOARD MINUTES

July 25, 1974

The Police Pension Board met in the City Manager's Office at City Hall at 9:00 a.m. Thursday, July 25, 1974. Present were City Manager Harvey Rose, Chairman; Captain Mike Chesnick, Police Department Representative, and City Clerk Neva Lockhart, Secretary. Finance Director Victor Vance was absent. Personnel Assistant Pat Bittle attended the meeting.

Item No. 1 - Consider request by Police Sargeant Larry O. Walsh to be placed on disability retirement effective August 1, 1974. Submitted for the record were letters from Arnold H. Greenhouse, M.D., and William L. Waldrop, M.D.

It was moved by Captain Chesnick and seconded by Neva Lockhart that the request be granted and Sargeant Walsh be placed on disability retirement at full benefits effective August 1, 1974. (\$500.50 per month)

Captain Mike Chesnick reported to the Board about certain legislative items being considered at the State level; namely, attempting to get a straight twenty-year retirement regardless of age; put the escalation clause into the Fund at the State level; amending the section whereby a child or children can receive one-eighth of the member's monthly salary from the time of member's death until such child shall reach the age of 18 rather than 16 as it presently is; and attempting to increase the amount of the widow's benefits. Captain Chesnick said that any or all of these items, if adopted, would not be effective until 1975.

The Chairman adjourned the meeting at 9:10 a.m.
