II. <u>DECISION - RESOLUTION OF FINDINGS AND DECISION RE:</u>

Ms. Sue Quezada, local manager of Inland Oil Products, Inc., and Ricci Investment Company, was present. Assistant City Attorney John Shaver submitted a Police Department report received from Grand Junction Police Officer Doug Norcross, supporting testimony that was presented at the Local Licensing Authority hearing conducted on December 1, 1993.  The Mesa County Health Department noted one violation (refrigeration) that must be corrected before the license is issued. The application was approved subject to receipt of a Health Department report indicating correction of this violation.

IV. APPLICATION FOR CHANGE OF OWNERSHIP

Application for a Hotel-Restaurant Liquor License by Kenny C. Quinnonez dba "Q" ALA RIBS and MORE, 755 North Avenue

The license is presently held by Dienno's Kitchen, Inc., dba Dienno's Kitchen.

Mr. Kenneth Charles Quinnonez was present. The Mesa County Health Department listed two major requirements that must be met by the applicant, a hand sink in the kitchen area and a mop sink. Quinnonez questioned how the Health Department can allow the current owner to operate under these conditions, yet require him to make the corrections. The application was approved subject to receipt of a Health Department report that states compliance.
