## Summary:

**5/1** – Bookcliff Liquor – male subject was beaten with a bat, threatened with a knife, suspect took money and personal belongings, patient was transported to St. Mary's; 648 33 ¾ Road – male subject punched a window during an argument while intoxicated, received multiple arm lacerations and was transported to St. Mary's, no crime reported; 317 Talon Drive – male subject was seen by neighbors arguing outside in his underwear with a female and small child crying, the RP tried to assist the female but the male restrained her, Officers took the subject in to custody on kidnapping charges

**5/3** – 29 Road and North Avenue, 3 year old male and his mother were hit by a GVT bus while crossing the street, child was transported to St. Mary's and later flown to Denver Children's Hospital where he passed away; 8<sup>th</sup> & Grand Ave – Passenger truck crashed into a motorcycle, motorcycle rider died from injuries sustained in the accident, was reported the male driver of the truck had a shotgun and fired a shot after exiting the vehicle, left the scene on foot and made his way to a nearby park on 10<sup>th</sup> and Hill, attempted to carjack another vehicle with a driver

and passengers before the GJPD contacted him, multiple shots were fired upon contact, suspect had multiple wounds and was transported to Community Hospital where he passed away.

**5/24** – Warrior Way and I-70 Business Loop – vehicle crash with two cars, the male driver of the vehicle that caused the accident was dead on arrival, the other driver was transported to St. Mary's with back pain; North 25<sup>th</sup> Street – Mother reported her 4 year old son missing, a community alert was sent to the area and the boy was later found safe on a neighboring street; Palisade Rim Trail – male crashed his bicycle, broken leg, ground crews had to hike in approximately 5 miles to his location, patient was transported via CareFlight to St. Mary's; 853 R Road – one vehicle rollover crash into a ditch, 3 patients, 1 male was in and out of consciousness and was transported by CareFlight, the other two were taken by Lower Valley Fire, GJFD Hazmat called out for fuel leaking into the creek; Highway 65 and 45 ½ Road – motorcycle crash, one male taken C3 to St. Mary's; 32 Road and D Road – motorcycle crash, female had a possible broken leg; Uncompahgre near Divide Road – single vehicle crash, 2 patients, multiple minor injuries.

**5/25** – Tabeguache Trail off Monument Road – SARC dispatched for a 37 year old male that crashed his bicycle and had ankle injuries; multiple fireworks and shots/noise complaints throughout the night during the JUCO firework display; Riverfront Trail near 29 ¼ Road – FELMEN – 1 male juvenile, with a group of three others, threatened a bicyclists with a machete when she asked the group to move over for her to pass, the group of kids ran from law enforcement, all four were eventually detained and one was taken in to custody.

**5/28** – DeBeque Canyon – small, military style plane flying too low clipped a power line, debris and power lines fell/struck traffic below, the plane landed safely at the Grand Jct Regional Airport, multiple vehicles damaged on the interstate

**5/29** – Main Street/Quincy's – 3 people stabbed during a fight, 2 males had facial lacerations and one female was stabbed in the chest, all transported to St. Mary's.

**5/30** – Colo National Monument/Highland View Overlook – 66 year old female crashed in to a rock wall, cracked her helmet and broke the bicycle in half, she was transported to St. Mary's; BLM shooting range area – 39 year old female taken to St. Mary's for possible heat stroke; Diversion Dam area – one vehicle accidentally backed in to the river and got stuck; Little Park Road and 21 ½ Road – 1 vehicle went off the road and down a ravine, 2 patients located, alert and conscious, transported to St. Mary's with multiple injuries; 27 ½ Road/Desert – GJFD witnessed an ATV rollover as they were leaving the desert for the heat stroke victim, 1 patient was taken to St. Mary's; 572 Dawn Court #2 – MCSO tasered a male who was threatening his neighbor (the RP) and permitting the RP from leaving his own apartment; 32 Road/Drag strip – 16 year old male crashed his dirt bike, was taken to the hospital in a personal vehicle with a possible broken collar bone.
