General architectural description: <u>This is a simple wood frame house with a low pitched side gable roof.</u> The main ridge runs east/west and the principal façade faces south. The entry door is located off center to the left and a large picture window, flanked by casements, is generally centered on the remaining wall to the left. Two smaller picture windows, flanked by casements, are located to either end of the remaining wall to the right. A rectangular brick chimney is applied to the west façade near the south wall. A set of concrete steps run to the landing in front of the door. The house sits on a concrete foundation with several basement windows around the perimeter. An addition to the rear of the house has a low pitched gable and a carport on the east side.
- 22. Architectural style/building type: <u>Ranch Type</u>
- 23. Landscaping or special setting features: <u>Several trees are located on this corner lot.</u> <u>Some shrubs and planting beds area located along the front, otherwise the yard is</u> <u>predominantly lawn.</u> The driveway runs off the side street at the rear.

This building is part of the High School Addition established in 1946. The owners were School District No. 1 of Mesa County, John F. Shafroth, Jr., Morrison Shafroth, Will Shafroth, and Platt Rogers (Trustee). The present Grand Junction High School was built in 1955 on the largest block.

- 42. Statement of significance: <u>The development in this area is a direct result of the nation's involvement in WWII and the drive for the development of nuclear weapons. The discovery of significant sources of Uranium in the region initiated development in Grand Junction that supported both the mining of the materials and the administration of programs related to the development of weapons. The building types, materials and neighborhood layout are all indicative of the national trends which were driven by the proliferation of the automobile and the enormous demand for single family homes. House designs departed from the romantic and revival styles that were prevalent in the earlier part of the 20th century and took on a California inspired design that was characterized by simple horizontally proportioned forms. Houses were typically mass produced on previously undeveloped tracts of land at the periphery of earlier.</u>

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development. These groups of houses were typically based on one or two plan types with a limited number of roof and exterior finish variations, further reinforcing the characteristics of mass production.




