#### MINUTES

## WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 5, 2007 9:00 a.m.

I. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u> - The meeting convened at 9:00 a.m. Those present were Hearing Officer Mike Grattan, City Attorney John Shaver and Deputy City Clerk Juanita Peterson.

## II. APPLICATIONS FOR SPECIAL EVENTS PERMITS

Ms. Debra Horwitz was present. Ms. Peterson reported that all of the reports were okay and the premise was posted in a timely manner. Ms. Peterson read the letter submitted by the applicant into the record for the request of the Special Event Permit.

City Attorney Shaver and Hearing Officer Grattan found the request met the requirements of State Statute 12-48-103 and approved the request.

Mr. Ron Ward was present. Ms. Peterson reported that all of the reports were okay and the premise was posted in a timely manner. Ms. Peterson read the letter submitted by the applicant into the record for the request of the Special Event Permit.

City Attorney Shaver and Hearing Officer Grattan found the request met the requirements of State Statute 12-48-103 and approved the request.

Hearing Officer Grattan and City Attorney Shaver had no objection to this.

Mr. Wayne Fisher was present. Hearing Officer Grattan stated that since no one was present at the last hearing, he requested clarification regarding the incident in June, 2006 to make sure there have been no other incidents since that date. Mr. Fisher stated there has not.

The application was found to be in order and approved.

The application was found to be in order and approved along with the Outdoor Dining Lease.

The application was found to be in order and approved.

4. **Dos Inc.**, dba Dos Hombres Restaurant, 421 Brach Drive, Grand Junction, CO 81503-2757, Hotel and Restaurant

The application was found to be in order and approved.

The application was found to be in order and approved.

Sanna and David Weaver were present. The application was found to be in order and approved.

9. **GJ North Avenue Liquors Inc.**, dba North Avenue Liquor, 801 North Avenue, Grand Junction CO 81501-3139, Retail Liquor Store

The application was found to be in order and approved.

10. **Inafuki Inc.**, dba Suehiro Japanese Restaurant, 541 Main Street, Grand Junction CO 81501, Hotel and Restaurant

The application was found to be in order and approved.

11. **The Corral Inc.**, dba The Corral, 539 Colorado Avenue, Grand Junction, CO 81501-2605, Tavern

Ms. Peterson stated the application was submitted in a timely manner and all the reports are fine with the exception of the lengthy police report for this establishment. Ms. Peterson asked since Hearing Officer Grattan, City Attorney Shaver, and Mr. Robertson received a copy of the report if they wanted her to read the report into the record. Hearing Officer Grattan stated only the summary. Hearing Officer Grattan made note of the complete police report from Officer Rix will be submitted into the record as Exhibit A.

Hearing Officer Grattan asked Officer Rix if he agreed with the summary Ms. Peterson read into the record and if Exhibit A is a true and accurate report made by him. Officer Rix stated yes, it is a true and accurate copy of the report.

Owner Mr. Steve Robertson and Floor Manager Kelly Barnett were both present. Mr. Robertson stated the first of July he met with Officer Rix and two other officers. Mr. Robertson said The Corral has been there for 44 years and provides a service to the downtown area. Since that meeting, Mr. Robertson has made two changes that Officer Rix asked: having only one point of entry into the establishment and removing the bench from the front of the building.

Hearing Officer Grattan noted several people in the audience and asked for them to come forward to speak.

Heather Heinbaugh, owner of 560 Salon, 560 Colorado Avenue addressed the Haring Officer. Ms. Heinbaugh stated she has a letter signed by businesses near The Corral, clients of these businesses, and workers who work for these businesses. The main concern is for the safety of all. Hearing Officer Grattan submitted the letter dated August 31, 2007 into the record as Exhibit B. Ms. Heinbaugh described the constant fighting, drunks in public, vandalism, hypodermic needles, vomit, and feces found around all of these businesses.

Ms. Heinbaugh stated they met with Mr. Robertson yesterday, September 4, 2007, with some ideas that they felt might help combat these problems. One

suggestion was to have a door man at The Corral to watch the door. Ms. Heinbaugh said Mr. Robertson won't even go into the front door of his own business after dark.

City Attorney Shaver asked Ms. Heinbaugh how long she has owned the business. Ms. Heinbaugh said she has owned this business for 1 ½ years. She stated when she opened the business the problems were daily frequency, but has gotten much worse.

Caole Lowry, owner of Plant Earth, 524 Colorado Avenue spoke next. She has been in business there for 12 ½ years. She stated Ms. Heinbaugh gave a great summary of what is happening and the last 2 years it has gotten much worse. She believes the caliber of the clientele at The Corral has gotten much worse. Ms. Lowry has examined a 25 page report from the police department on incidents around the area. She has witnessed daily drunks sleeping in parking lots or in the breezeway. Ms. Lowry liked the area she was in as it fit the "artists" that she has as her clients. Her business has suffered; she has worked with The Corral for many years, but now it is affecting her financially; she is in hopes that Mr. Robertson sees there is a problem.

Marsha Murraye, Colorado Java House, 502 Colorado Avenue then spoke. Ms. Murraye has owned the business for 1 ½ years. Ms. Murraye has witnessed drunkenness, fighting, persons walking into traffic on 5<sup>th</sup> Street and persons flagging down cars for rides. Ms. Murraye has also had damaged furniture which she has outside in front of her business. She has been asked to stay open a few nights a week, but does not feel the area is safe for her or her clients, and all of this is affecting her business.

Harold Stalf, Executive Director DDA/DTA met on "National Night Out" at Two Rivers Convention Center with several business owners and police officers and the entire meeting turned to the issues surrounding The Corral. Mr. Stalf said they encourage economic development in the downtown area. This situation jeopardizes that and needs to be addressed.

Mr. Robertson said there are 4 liquor licenses in the area and 20 in three blocks. Since the smoking ordinance came into effect, there is usually 27 people outside of his building at most times smoking. His customers are not afraid of the police. Mr. Robertson believes that he attracts more "rats" than the average bar. He moved the smoking area from the back to the front at the request of the police officers. Mr. Robertson stated they do not serve drunks. The bartender has a certain amount of control in the bar, but not outside. Mr. Robertson said he does not know the solution and these businesses should not have located on "skid row" if they wanted to be successful. Mr. Robertson said the suggestions given to him from the meeting were to be at his business more and to hire someone to watch the front door, which he can not afford the cost of security at \$25/hr.

Mr. Barnett stated he has been at The Corral for 13 years. He wanted to address the issue of the vomit, feces, and needles as he feels they are not coming from The Corral. Anyone can destroy furniture and it should not be left out. He believes in the last 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  years it has gotten worse since the smoking ordinance went into effect.

City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Barnett if he was the manager. Mr. Barnett said he is the floor manager and has been there 13 years and they can only take care of the inside of the establishment. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Barnett what training is given to the employees. Mr. Barnett said he and several of the employees have been to the liquor awareness training and "hopefully" they come trained when they are hired, if not, he provides training in the establishment. City Attorney Shaver asked if they have any written policy. Mr. Barnett stated no. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Barnett if they have a Colorado Liquor Code of Regulations book in the establishment. Mr. Barnett stated yes. City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Barnett if he was familiar with Regulation 47-900, Conduct of Establishment, and read this to Mr. Barnett. Mr. Barnett again stated they can't take care of the outside, only the inside.

City Attorney Shaver asked if they understood that the license can be suspended, revoked, or cancelled. Mr. Robertson answered yes.

City Attorney Shaver stated that under the Grand Junction Code of Ordinances they have the responsibility to call the police. Mr. Barnett said yes, and that he and his employees do call the police.

City Attorney Shaver noted that since Mr. Robertson has admitted several times that he realizes there is a problem with his establishment and asked him what he has done about this.

Mr. Robertson stated he can only try and take care of the inside of the bar.

City Attorney Shaver stated from previous testimony that the only thing Mr. Robertson has done is move the bench.

Mr. Robertson said no. He has created one entry at the front door, painted, and taken the bench out. He painted a line 15' from the door on the sidewalk but can't control the customers outside. All of this has been done to try and control the crowd outside.

Mr. Robertson asked City Attorney Shaver what the solution is. Hearing Officer Grattan told Mr. Robertson he is not to ask questions and suggested Mr. Robertson contact the City Attorney's office to speak to Mr. Shaver.

City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Robertson if he was familiar with Regulation 47-900. Mr. Robertson responded yes and Mr. Robertson referred to the police report that several of those items were from the same person, coming back into his establishment.

City Attorney Shaver stated these are always difficult matters. The Colorado Liquor Code does not address how to address these issues. All of the "technical" paperwork has been met. These other issues can be referred to the City Attorney's office for review and investigated for prosecution. All of this being said, this is a very serious problem and the Authority has listened to the people from the testimony and by the report, it shows evidence of the same.

Officer Rix wanted to clarify the police report, that he only documented the problems related to The Corral and its patrons. The summary speaks for itself. Officer Rix did say The Corral employees have attended the alcohol server responsibility training he gives through the City. There is an indication that there are overservice issues to look at.

Hearing Officer Grattan concurred with City Attorney Shaver regarding the formality of the paperwork of the renewal has been met. Hearing Officer Grattan approved the renewal and made the following findings of fact: problems outside of the establishments, the problems have gotten worse in the last two years, Mr. Robertson acknowledges the problems, there is understanding of the authority of the positions of each, and there is no written policy and insufficient training. Hearing Officer Grattan wants a 90 day review for the first liquor hearing in December and continue the reviews each 90 days thereafter. He encourages Mr. Robertson to meet with City Attorney Shaver. Hearing Officer Grattan encouraged the Police Department to be clearer regarding the reporting and he would like to refer to the City Attorney's office this report for possible prosecution of these matters.

The following summary and attached reports document police calls for service between August 01, 2006 and August 24, 2007 for the Corral Bar, 539 Colorado Avenue, GJ.CO.

## **Summary:**

A total of 262 police service calls were compiled through researching the GVCC (Grand Valley Communication Center, and GJPD records. The service calls are further broken down for each month in to number of arrests made with brief narrative summaries. Of the 262 police service calls, only 42 had actual documented involvement directly with the Corral Bar.

The other 220 police service calls to 539 Colorado Avenue had no reports to further explain the call or its relation to the call address. A majority of these calls involve the 500 Block area of where the Coral Bar is located and were cleared by the officer as an assist, verbal warning, or gone on arrival.

There were 40 arrests made out of the 42 calls for service and only involved patrons of the bar, none were employees.
