Louis Boyd, Owner, was present. Ms. Peterson reported all of the reports were fine for the renewal except the report from Mesa County Health Department was not in. Ms. Peterson read the summary of the police report into the record (see attached). Ms. Peterson read the results of the survey for the modification of premises into the report (see attached), and reported that Monday night, October 1, 2007, the City Council approved the Revocable Permit which allows for 10 existing parking spaces and an existing free standing sign to exist within the 28 1/4 Road right of way.

City Attorney Shaver asked Mr. Boyd to describe the neighborhood around his establishment. Mr. Boyd said there are two trailer parks, Jamestown and Niagara Village, a daycare across the street, along with a bank and hair salon. Mr. Boyd said the trailer park closest to him is a "rent by the week" and Mr. Boyd concentrated on that area for his survey as he felt they would be the ones who would be most impacted on the modification. Mr. Boyd said the sole purpose of the modification is to add an area where the smokers could go to smoke and to drink. The smoking ordinance really affected his business.

City Attorney Shaver referred to the police summary Ms. Peterson read into the record regarding all calls not related to the bar itself and asked Mr. Boyd if these calls could be related to the type of dwellings in the area. Mr. Boyd said he would agree that it could, but the overall area has improved in the last 8 years.

Hearing Officer Grattan and City Attorney Shaver concurred with the approval of the renewal and the modification of premises. Hearing Officer Grattan noted there was no one in the audience to oppose or to contest this modification. Both were approved.

# The following background information check was completed through local computer records information from both the Mesa County Sheriff's, Grand Junction Police departments, and based only on the information contained below as provided to include Individual History Record when provided.

I have checked the local criminal history for the last year on the person(s) and business(es) listed below. I have found nothing unusual or derogatory which would hinder the issuance of these license(s) for the persons or businesses listed below.

The following summary and attached reports document police calls for service between September 01, 2006 and September 12, 2007 for the Whiskey River bar, 539 490 28 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Rd, GJ.CO.

#### Summary:

A total of 85 police service calls were compiled through researching the GVCC (Grand Valley Communication Center, and GJPD records. The service calls are further broken down for each month in to number of arrests made with brief narrative summaries. Of the 85 police service calls, only 28 had actual documented involvement directly with Whiskey River bar.

The remaining 57 police service calls to 490 28 ¼ Rd had no reports to further explain the call or its relation to the call address. A majority of these calls involve the area within the block of 490 28 ¼ Rd, and were cleared by the officer as an assist, verbal warning, or gone on arrival.

There were a total of 13 arrests made from the 57 police calls for service and only involved patrons of the bar, none were employees, and no reports of any unlawful acts by employees.

On 090707 at approximately 2314 hours I, Officer Daugherty, observed Jeffry Bruce (102461) lying on the ground in the parking lot of 490 28 1/4 Rd. He was lying, apparently unconscious, on the ground with his head about 6 inches from the front tire of a truck in the parking lot.

Bruce appeared to be unconscious. I attempted to wake Bruce and was unable. I called for GJFD and they responded. They were able to wake Bruce and he appeared to be intoxicated. Bruce had a strong odor of alcohol from his breath and he did not know where he would stay for the night nor how he would get there.

Bruce refused any medical evaluation and was taken to Colorado West for an M1 Alcohol Hold. Bruce was clearly intoxicated and a clear danger to himself and others due to his level of intoxication.

Tyluk, Inc., filed an application with the Local Licensing Authority on September 10, 2007 for a modification of premises for a tavern liquor license permitting sales of malt, vinous and spirituous liquors by the drink for consumption on the premises at 490 28 ¼ Road, under the trade name of Whiskey River. The modification is to include an outdoor patio area in their licensed area. The supplementary documents were reviewed, found to be in order and accepted. The hearing date was set for October 3, 2007.

In order to address the reasonable requirements of the neighborhood and the desires of the adult inhabitants of the neighborhood, the applicant conducted a survey. The neighborhood was defined as the area bounded on the North by Texas Avenue, on the South by I-70 Business Loop, on the East by Melody Lane, and on the West by 23<sup>rd</sup> Street (if extended). The results of that survey are as follows:

1. As an owner of property in the neighborhood, an employee or business lessee of property in the neighborhood and/or an inhabitant who resides in the neighborhood for more than six months each year, I believe the proposed modification of premises to increase patio seating will not conflict with the reasonable requirements of the neighborhood or the desires of the inhabitants.
