architectural description: Two-story commercial brick building with tile facade. Columns on the street level continue in a border to frame the facade roofline. Decorative tile work on upper level. Upper level windows are new and center portion is recessed and has door. Decorative molding around windows may be original. A painted wood porch has been added at the second level which has a small octagon opening in the center. Display windows with painted wood trim and kickplates are at the street level. Two recessed entrances on either side of the display windows are wood with glass panels. Clerestory is glass with trim work above.

New facade including windows, porch, entrances-early 1920s, 1950s and since 1982.

historic background (discuss important persons and events associated with this structure)

This structure is located within the original platted area of Grand Junction. The Egyptian art deco terra cotta was manufactured in a plant in Delta.

This building became a two-story by 1893. In 1898 James Cosgrove is the owner. Here he located his Board of Trade solution downstairs, and at least at times, the Democratic Club upstairs (whether this is affiliated with the political party may be questionable). Also in 435 was the Interstate Cigar Store, and perhaps the Orpheum Theatre in 437 (or it was the next door Lot 10). Cosgrove's wife was a staunch supporter of St. Mary's Hospital during its early construction, lending her parlor for ladies to sew sheets, curtains and towels. The building on Lot 9 was known as the Cosgrove Block. A store operated by Cosgrove and W.P. Stough (embalmer) carried furniture and carpets, plus functioned as an undertaker. By 1912 there was again (or perhaps "still") a cigar store at 435 Main, this time owned by W.H. and I.R. Lewis. The 1916 assessor's roll shows the building in Lot 9 at \$4180, \$1000 more than the neighboring east half of the Union Block. By 1928 Samuel G. McMullin's Home Loan & Investment Co. apparently holds title to the structure. After McMullin's murder in 1946, his son Howard became the property owner. Western Union Telegraph Co., managed by Walter Beckley, was 435 Main's tenant ca. 1930 through at least 1957.
