This structure is located within the original platted area of Grand Junction and was representative of the late 1890s town building. The first building appeared on this site between 1886 and 1890, a small grocery store. By 1893 it had become a sausage factory, with a front meat sales section. Real estate and insurance salesman John Williams owned the building by 1898 and occupied the west half of the building with his insurance business. Henrietta Sieber, widow of slain cattleman Charles Sieber, was owner of the property by 1903. The Groves & Smith Bicycle Shop and the White Front Barber Shop share the 436 Main Street side, while Walker & Jones insurance agency was on the east side.

By 1907 the Bucklin family had purchased the building, E.E. Chapin's bicycle shop was in 436 main Street and E.H. Jepson's Barber Shop occupied 438 Main Street. By 1918, Bannister Brothers furniture store occupied 438 Main Street but moved when the Quality Grocery and Market occupied the building in 1924. Etta Lapham became owner during the succeeding two years and the building had expanded north to the alley. It passes into the ownership of Louis Bucklin by 1936; Elijah Bucklin was added as an owner by 1947.

Ollie Bannister's furniture store encompasses 430-436 Main Street by 1928 which seems to indicate f renumbering of Main Street businesses. The 438 Main Street address was occupied by Sally Ann Baking Company by 1937; Dutch Oven Bakery in 1939; and Max Solko's men's clothing store in 1941. Solko's remained at this location through at least 1957.




