historic background (discuss important persons and events associated with this structure) This structure is located within the original platted area of Grand Junction and was representative of the early 1900s town building.

This ground stayed bare until about 1922. During that time, it was first owned by the Devereaux Brothers (or Investment Co.) of Aspen, then the Fair Building Co. (perhaps planned for an expansion of William Moyers' Fair Store.) Clothing store owner John Wolf acquired the property in 1921, and erected the existing building the following year. Kissinger's Toggery was the first occupant of the Main Street store front (ca. 1928-1932); followed by McGuires's Apparel Shop (ca. 1935-1937), then the long running Vick's Pastry Shop (ca. 1939-1957+.)




