Age Requirements for Employees at Liquor Establishments

Licensees often have questions concerning age requirements for their employees. The answer depends on the type of liquor license and the extent of the employee's duties keeping in mind the following:

○ **3.2% Beer License** -



An employee of a 3.2 beer licensed establishment who is at least 18 years of age is allowed to handle, stock, sell, serve, or dispense 3.2% beer. An employee under age 18 is permitted to "handle" or "stock" 3.2% beer under the on-premise supervision of a person at least 18 years of age.

○ **On-premises Liquor Licenses** -

Malt, wine and spirituous liquor may be handled, dispensed or sold



(includes wait staff and bartenders) by anyone at least 18 years of age if they are supervised on the premises by a person at least 21 years of age. Exceptions are for Retail Liquor Stores and Tavern liquor licensed establishments that do not regularly serve meals; only persons at least 21 years of age may sell malt, wine, and spirituous liquor in these establishments. A person of any age may bus tables or handle empty alcoholic beverage containers.

○ **Off-premise Liquor Licenses** -

Employees of retail liquor stores must be 21 years old to sell or distribute malt, wine, or spirituous liquors.

Legislative Updates



SB 05-058 extends the "cork and go" with an unfinished bottle of wine legislated in 2004 for hotel and restaurant liquor licensees to allow removal of alcohol from establishments with a limited winery, beer and wine, tavern, brew pub, or vintner's restaurant license provided that the licensee serves meals. This law became effective 4/22/05.

HB 05-1122, without pre-empting local open container ordinances, will make it illegal to have an alcoholic beverage container with a broken seal anywhere in a vehicle, unless it is stored in the farthest possible location away from the driver and passengers. There are some limited exceptions for passengers for specific types of vehicles (motor homes and limousines). This law becomes effective July 1, 2005.

HB 05-1236, allows ownership of different types of licenses as follows: beer & wine, hotel & restaurant, tavern, brew pub, club, arts, racetrack, public transportation, optional premises, retail gaming tavern, vintner's, and bed & breakfast. This law becomes effective August 8, 2005.
