Free Drinks

Alcohol sales and service is a competitive and highly regulated industry. Licensees are always trying to find creative ways to attract customers,

however, one method currently in use by some licensees may be illegal, and could put a licensee's license in jeopardy.

The tactic of offering free drinks either for a period of time or to a certain people (i.e. students or females) as an enticement into an establishment has repercussions to liquor licensees. A license is defined as a "...grant to a licensee to manufacture or sell malt, vinous or spirituous liquors..." (Colorado Revised Statutes, section 12-47-103 (13)). A sale is defined as, among other things, "...to deliver for value or in any other way other than gratuitously..." (Colorado Revised Statutes, section 12-47-103 (34)). Only if you are a hotel, may you provide complimentary alcoholic beverages, and only then, in sealed containers (Colorado Revised Statutes, section 12-47-411 (3)(a)).

Why would the City care about a business furnishing free drinks? The giving away of drinks is generally an enticement to purchase

more alcohol. If a person starts off drinking for free, it is more likely that person will become intoxicated, and if you serve too much, you will potentially lose your license. Section 12-47-901 (a) prohibits the sale or giving away of alcohol to a visibly intoxicated person—something which is more difficult for the licensee to control if drinks are complimentary. Regulation 47-900 also requires licensed premises to be conducted in a, "... decent, orderly, and respectable manner..." The serving or loitering of visibly intoxicated persons or "...rowdiness, undue noise, or other disturbances or activities offensive to the senses of the average citizen..." are also prohibited. Again, the giving away of drinks makes it more likely that persons will become intoxicated which could lead to the activities stated above.
