Dear Sir:

I have evaluated the best potential for the requested maintenance program which the City of Grand Junction is under contract to perform for Central Grand Valley District. We have apportioned this District into four (4) work or program areas as follows:

- Area 1 (Mapped in blue) covers the area starting approximately 284 Road west to 30 Road on the east, than north to the Highline Canal, south to approximately Orchard Avenue omitting any and all of Fruitvale Sanitation District.
- Area 2 (Mapped in light yellow) covers from 30 Road east approximately to 31 3/4 Road, north from the railroad to F 3/10 Road omitting any and all of Clifton Sanitation District. This would be the first 2 sections of your system that the City would clean under our agreement January to December 1982.
- Area 3 (Mapped in green south of D&RG tracks) east of 30 Road to approximately 32 Road, north from river to the railroad tracks.
- Area 4 (Mapped in orange south of D&RG tracks) west of 30 Road to approximately 27 Road from the Colorado River to the D&RG tracks. This is to be the second stage of the cleaning maintenance program and would be expected to run from January 1963 to December 1983 at which time the cleaning program would start over.

However, you should consider that the City has, at present, only two trucks and crews to cover over 200 miles of sewer line maintenance along with special cleaning areas so they will not be able to schedule a firm day, date commitment to any program.

These same people also work on sever and water breaks and special request programs which does take a portion of their time. These same four people also maintain the City of Grand Junction Sewers, Ridges, Bluff West, Paradise Hills and a portion of Orchard Mesa's sewers on an everyday basis. Another problem which must be considered is in extreme cold weather, these trucks cannot be used due to freezing of hoses, pipes and tanks.

We will do all we can with the equipment, crews and time available to the City toward meeting this purposed maintenance schedule of C. G. Y. sewer systems. (See enclosed map).
