I received your notations on my memo concerning the Roger Moore proposal. I am confused and somewhat disturbed by it. According to your notations, now I must deal with a third party, Terry Summerfeld. Since Terry is in the picture and as I told you at Gordon's meeting, we will be pulling out of the UST program for the reasons stated.

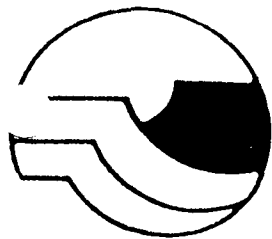
Since Terry has several good reasons for reservations on undertaking such a study in 1988, let him worry about the budget problem and the Commissioners. We have reviewed the situation and supported Terry as far as we can go. He is better equipped to ask for the budget and to handle the competitive bidding.

What I need from you is a meeting set up with the Commissioners and the Board of Health to establish some direction on the Board of Health Variances. The Board of Health has been giving out Variances on a 3 month basis with the hope that the City is taking on the work of the sewer lines and the connecting work to the owners of the failing septic systems. The Board is still waiting to see what the Commissioners plan to do on this problem.

The other matter is the Persigo plant. I would like to have some kind of direction from the Commissioners on where the County stands concerning the Persigo plant before we have the Air Quality Control Notice of Violation on August 5th. This business of getting back to the Commissioners on Persigo has gone on long enough. Let's do something about it one way or another.
