SUMMARY OF COSTS

Construction Costs: The total cost of the collection system, including contingencies, engineering, legal and other expenses is estimated to be \$3,030,000.

If an independent sewage disposal plant is required, the cost is estimated to be \$900,000.

Contract Costs: The preliminary cost figures for transmission, treatment, operation and maintenance and billing by the City of Grand Junction are as follows:

Trunk charge payable to City . . . \$100.00/tap (pd. once)

Monthly charge payable to city

for transmission, treatment,

0 & M and billing services 3.45/tap / month

REPAYMENT

Source of Construction Funds: Although efforts are being made to secure assistance through governmental agencies, for possible grant and loan assistence, the most likely source of financing is through conventional private channels.

Monthly Service Charges (Including \$3.45 to City).\$ 10.00

Treatment Facilities: The City of Grand Junction has proposed to treat sewage for the District, operate and maintain the system and do the billing for the following charges:

Trunk Charge \$100.00 per individual tap

Monthly Charge \$3.45

An analysis of the charges proposed by the city was made to determine an alternate cost which could be supported by the same investment. It was determined that an investment of \$900,000 for an independent plant could be justified.

Preliminary estimates indicate that this sum would be adequate.

Summary of Capital Costs: As developed above, the total project cost to be repaid is as follows:

SOURCES OF REVENUE

Tap Fees: An initial tap fee of \$600 for each equivalent residential sewer tap is recommended. Subsequent taps, which are required after construction work is completed, at the site of the tap, should be more. A sum of \$800 is recommended. A sum of \$100 for each tap must be paid to the City of Grand Junction as a "Trunk Charge". This amount is included in the tap fees, as suggested.
