As you know, we have recently had certain development applications for land on the edge of the 201 sewer planning and service area.

We are very much concerned that the rigid boundary line may be somewhat arbitrary and that the basis for drawing that line has probably become outdated over the last seven or eight years.

Therefore, we have asked our staff and consultants to investigate methods by which this boundary could be changed. We have no intention of causing it to be changed for one particular developer. ~~If any changes are made, they clearly should be made in accordance with an overall policy.~~ We recognize that the City and County must work together in adopting that policy. However, most of the fringe areas are under the jurisdiction of the County and thus we feel the greatest pressure to examine the issue.

After we have developed more information on how the service area can be changed or made more flexible, we would like to sit down and talk with you about the joint adoption of an approach that would be satisfactory both to the City and to the County.
