Notice on ISDS Permits

The Environmental Health Staff has finally agreed on the notice to be put on the bottom of the ISDS permits. It reads as follows:

NOTICE

The use of an ISDS is considered to be a temporary means of sewage disposal. If at any time the disposal system fails to operate or does not meet the intent of the regulations, and the property is located within a designated sewer service area, the owner will be required to connect to that system in accordance with CRS 31-35-601, 31-15-709 and/or 30-20-416. (Individual Sewage Disposal Systems Regulations Sections 25-1-507(d), 25-10-106 and 25-10-104(2), CRS 1973; Guidelines on Individual Sewage Disposal Systems Revised 1984, Colorado State Board of Health Article 10, Title 25, CRS 1973; Joint Ordinance and Resolution of the City of Grand Junction and the County of Mesa, Colorado, Ordinance No. 1973, Resolution No. MCM 80-49, March 26, 1980; Mesa County Land Development Code, Section 4.1.5.A, #MCM 83-206(A); Section 31-35-601, Part 6, CRS 1973, Section 31-15-709 and Section 30-20-416)
