

Colorful fire names reflect state's u

Son-of-a-Gun. Wake. Renegade Point.

The names given to fires breaking out in Colorado recently are as colorful as the state's unique geography.

Most seem obviously tied to a specific locale.

Take the Elk Springs fire, 15 miles southwest of Aybell near the small community of Elk Springs, which it almost overwhelmed late Monday.

Others seem like their names may have more to do with emotion than geography.

Son-of-a-Gun, on the west rim of the Gunnison Gorge, is a case in point.

"It might have just been an expression of our frustration," said Roger Alexander of the U.S. Bureau of Land Management in Montrose.

Upon further investigation, however, Alexander found the fire was located directly across the gorge from Son-of-a-Gun Gulch. Because initial reports put the fire on the opposite side of the gorge, it was named for the geologic feature nearest to it.

Even though the name turned out to be somewhat inaccurate, geographically, Alexander said. "It's still

a helluva good name for a fire."

Rule 4.9.1

As of the adoption hereof, no connection shall be made to the System with respect to any use or development with regard to which the bids for construction of, or construction of, infrastructure has occurred, that varies from or is different than adopted City standards and specifications, including, but not limited to, sewer and water line and facilities standards, street and other rights-of-way standards, curb, gutter and sidewalk standards and landscaping, and standards for pedestrian and bicycle ways. The Manager may, when the Manager determines it to be impracticable, decline to enforce this rule.

Rule 4.9.2

Effective upon adoption of this Resolution, no connection shall be made to the System with respect to any use or development which does not receive the prior approval of the Manager, with respect to the development standards of the City. The Manager may, when the Manager determines it to be impracticable, decline to enforce this rule.
