architectural description: Two-story, commercial stucco building which appears to be a combination of several buildings. One-over-one sashed windows are on the east portion of the building's facade on second level. Display windows are on the street level with brick kickplate. The west side of building has a mission-style roof. An awning across the front of the building has rust tiles. The west wall of the building has an offset recessed entry with display windows on either side of glass door with transom. An addition on front portion of the roof is of painted wood with large covered windows, hip roof with brick chimney. Five small three-over-three windows are also along the west wall. Two other additions appear on the rear, east side. This appears to have been a house with brick chimney and enclosed rear porch with windows surrounding. A detached cinder block garage is at the rear.
