Large display windows are on the street level with a recessed entry on the 3rd Street side with double glass doors and a shed type wood awning over the entrance. An offset single glass door on the north side of the building leads to a separate business. New windows appear on the second and third levels.

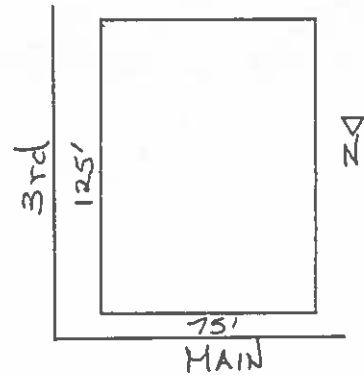
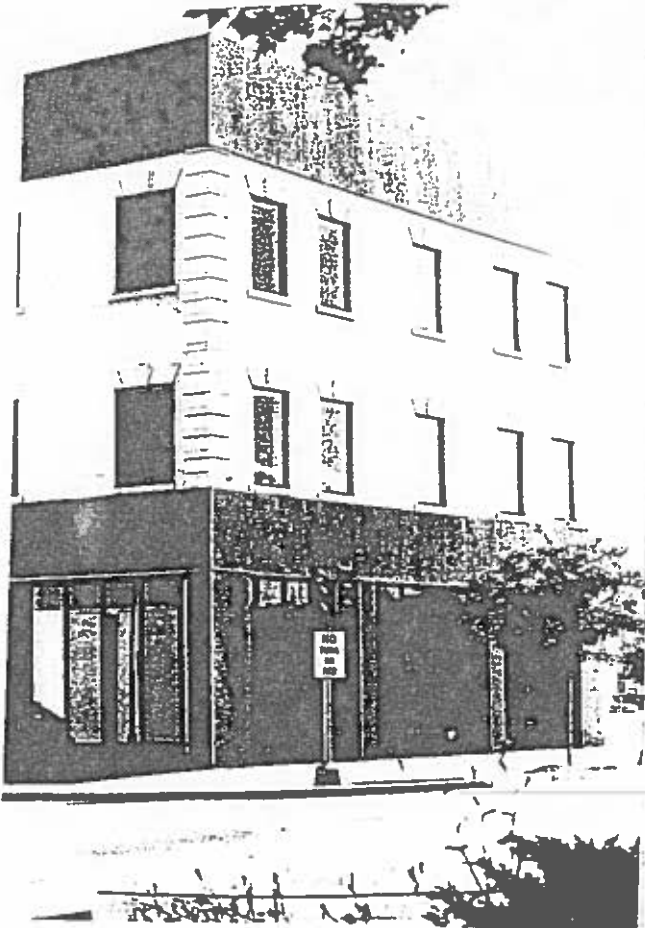
