architectural description: Two-story commercial brick structure which has been stuccoed and painted. Three verticle two-over-one windows are on second level. A double glass doorway with glass transom and signage is on the left side of the building and leads to the second story. The lower level has been covered with diagonal painted wood and has a recessed entrance with wood and glass door. Wood framed display windows with signage are on either side of the entrance and have brick kickplates, which may be original.

historic background (discuss important persons and events associated with this structure) This structure is located within the original platted area of Grand Junction and was representative of the 1890s town building.

The 2-story building was complete by 1890, sharing a stairway and skylight with the attached building on lot 26. Its eastern half is first listed as belonging to a Seth Gifford of Haverford, PA; the 1905 Polk lists it as the Gifford Block. Perhaps this building was a speculative venture on the part of Wm. Royston and/or First National Bank. Its owner ca 1907-1934 was a Harriet McReynolds, before its 1936 purchase by Carl and Frieda Fortney. Manuel's Economy Store was in 530 Main, 1926 through at least 1931. By 1937, florist Jacob Watson, community benefactor, was in 530 until at least 1957. Pantuso's Smart Footwear had joined him by 1943.
