historic background (discuss important persons and events associated with this structure) This structure is located within the original platted area of Grand Junction and was representative of the 1900s town building.

The earliest Sanborn map shows a small church on this site in 1886. The building's owner is the First National Bank. Josephine Rich owned the building by 1903; her son Charles, was the City treasurer in 1904, and the building's occupant in 1905, as owner of Rich-Hutchinson Reality. A.R. Sampliner acquired the building in 1918, and added his cousin Joseph to the title about 1933. By 1920, Mutual Savings & Building Association occupied 5437, with W.A. Marsh as its chief officer. O.D. Williams' Independent Abstract was listed at 539 Main, 1920-1930. Arcieri and Sons' flower shop occupied 539 Main for a short time in the 1930's. From at least 1937 to about 1949, Palmer's Clothing gave its address as 537. It was combined with Lot 9 in 1952, but, at least for taxing purposes, appears as a separate entity again by 1955, with its occupant Paul Stout's, The Squire Shop. Like several other buildings in the Main Street corridor, 537-539 Main is listed on the assessor's books as part of the Sampliner estate from 1940 on through at least 1957.
