architectural description: Two level brick plaza with brick columns and rod iron railings which are contiguous with the columns at 646/650 and the 634 office building. (The office building and plaza have the same address.) There is an alleyway on the east side of the plaza leading to a business on the side near the rear. Awnings are over the recessed windows, antique replica light fixtures are along the wall, a wood sign extends from the entrance, wooden flower barrels are on walkway, and wood beams are above connecting with the building to the west. A stairway at the front side of the plaza leads to offices below ground. Trees are planted in the lower level which extend above the brick columns on the street level. There is a walkway on the west side of the plaza which leads to the rear building (possible original, but no information available) which has a glass door and display window. The 634 law office is a modern brick structure with recessed front and display windows, brick kickplates, recessed offset entry with brick columns. The door is glass.
