This structure is located within the original platted area of Grand Junction and was representative of the early 1900 town building.

The forerunner of the City Market grocery chain was started in the back of this building in the mid-1920s by the Prinster family, founders of today's multi-state enterprise. Mesa Drug, the building's longest occupant, was located here from around 1918 until 1987. John and Bobbie Cesario, owners of B & J's Coffee Shop, one of the present building occupants, met and worked at the drug store soda fountain while in high school.
