6/1/15 - 2976 Globe Willow Ave -50 year old male found deceased from a stab wound, suspect was an ex-wife and fled to Fort Collins where she later committed suicide while being pursued by law enforcement; $2980 \frac{1}{2}$ Texas Ave – 37 year old male found hanging in a shed, DOA, apparent suicide.

6/10/15 – multiple reports of FAUTO in the area of Peachwood and Bookcliff Ave. 6/12/15 – 2373 G Road – single motorcycle crash, 45 year old male transported C3 to St. Mary's; 18 year old suicidal female walked away from Colo West Mental Heath, climbed over the guardrail on the 29 Road/I-70 Business Loop overpass attempting to jump, was stopped by GJPD and MCSO and taken to St. Mary's. 6/13/15 - I-70 Mile Marker 57 - 4 vehicles were hit by falling rocks, no injuries reported; 243 Linden – motorcycle vs. vehicle, 2 patients taken to St. Mary's; Watson Island – one subject was rescued after wrapping their boat around a bridge pillar, no injuries; I-70 Mile Marker 218 – 1 vehicle crash, 3 patients involved, two were transported to St. Mary's by ambulance, one taken by Moab Careflight; 27 ¹/₄ Road & the Desert – dirtbike crash, one male with tibia/fibula fracture and

was transported to St. Mary's; 32 Road & the river near Corn Lake – 3 female subjects ages 9-13 were yelling for help from the river, none of them were wearing life jackets, found and rescued safely; Cactus Park area – 31 year old male fell approximately 10 feet down a cliff, minor injuries to his knee; I-70 and Horizon Drive – 40 year old motorcyclist hit by another vehicle.

6/14/15 - 3094 Silver Crest Trail – male subject pointed a semi-automatic handgun at his wife and daughter, male was tased and taken in to custody.

6/22/15 – Grd Jct Regional Airport – aircraft attempted to land with flap trouble, 44 people were on board and the plane landed without incident; River Front Trail behind Banana's Fun Park – brush fire that was difficult to get to because of high water and closed off trail, handled by GJFD, no structure damages.

6/24/15 – CBI building – 35 year old male sprayed in the face with unknown chemical; approximately 8-10 gallons of acid spilled outside, required a full HAZMAT response, patient treated for eye injuries; MCSO assisted in getting BLM firefighters down to the river from Loma to Ruby & Horsethief Canyons for a small fire along the railroad tracks.

6/25/15 – 437 32 Road – Robbery, male suspect armed with a firearm, left the convenience store with approximately \$250, suspect was not located; A Crimestoppers tip led to an arrest and heroine bust.

 $6/29/15 - 7^{\text{th}}$ and Ute – truck vs. bicyclist who rode through a red light, 21 year old male was transported to the hospital and later died from his injuries; 618 Susan Street – 2 ½ year old autistic child was reported missing, a reverse notification was sent to the area and the child was found safe.

<u>Summary</u> (crime scenes activity, court appearances, complex cases, use of resources, problems or unusual events):

Two Lab employees and a Forensic Investigator from Investigations assisted CMU with the second annual CSI@CMU class. This is a four day class offered to High School students who have an interest in Forensic Sciences. Classes taught by our employees included photography, pattern impressions (i.e. fingerprints & footprints), blood spatter, sketching, and two mock crime scenes.

Nine new Forensic Investigators (F.I.) were given a 20 hour basic Crime Scene Class. Class was taught by the three Criminalists. All nine FI's are assigned to Patrol. There are an additional 10 officers still needing training, but staffing levels limited who received training. Training included photography (including night photography), sketching, evidence collection, using metal detectors, and two practical crime scene scenarios.
