architectural description: Very large, modern brick building with large recessed display windows on the first level and narrow plate glass windows are on the second level. The entrance to the bank is at an angle on the corner of Main and 4th Streets. It has curved mirror glass with doors. A breezeway separates the bank from the annex to the west. Kickplates are of the same brick, but at an angle to the windows. Clerestory over the display windows are glass. A large metal sculpture is at the entrance to the bank.
