

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One and a half story with cross gables. Flagstone stoop under small entry wing at center of facade. Entry gable has a lower, flared catalide eave on the south. Arched front door is paneled, with one light. Screen door. Adjacent to the south side of facade is a sunporch, glazed with large single lights. Windows are paired double hung wood sash, six-over-six and paired casements, eight lights each. Several louvered shutters. Medium gray shake siding with gray stucco and decorative half-timbered gables. Door and window surrounds, half-timbering, comices, screen
