ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Two story with hip roof. Concrete block foundation. Wood steps with brick plers lead up to screened porch with hip roof extending nearly full width of facade. Porch half-wall is shingled down to ground level. Four squared half columns are placed across porch. Screen door. Front door is 4' wide, flush oak with single light and is flanked by single pane sidelights. Windows are double hung wood eash, nine and twelve over one. Several larger first floor windows are fifteen over one. Two small second floor facade windows are diamond panes with wood muntins. Projecting bay window on west elevation has hip roof. Two tier back porches are glazed with single lights. Narrow lapped siding is pale green. Door and window surrounds, comer boards, perch columns and rafter ends are white. Foundation, cornices, friezes, muntins, screen door and chimneys are dark green. Cedar shingle roof. Hip roof dormer on south slope has two windows with six lights each. Exposed ornately shaped rafter ends under boxed eaves on principal roof, porches, dormer and bay. Brick chimney on north slope and full height fireplace chimney on west elevation.

Landscaped with lawn, small bushes by porch and trellises on west end of porch. High, unpainted wood fence around backyard. Wood retaining curb around lawn by sidewalk. Elm trees in parking area.

One car garage built into north elevation. Swinging wood doors have six lights each.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): This house is historically significant for its connection to Edward C. Martin, owner of Martin's Mortuary. Constructed in ca. 1908, the house was first owned by D. Walter Clark. The first known occupants, ca. 1910-1924, were owners Mary and Dr. H.S. Henderson who resided in the house ca. 1910-1924. Janet and Harry Kissinger, a department manager for he Fair Store, were the owners/occupants ca. 1925-1931, and 1935-1936. Kissinger, then of Kissinger's Toggery, also resided in the house ca. 1932-1934, renting it from C. G. Bradfield. The Martin's owned and resided in the house ca. 1938-1953.
