Summary:

8/3 – 2231 Broadway – 45 year old female accidentally shot in the chest when the RP pulled a loaded gun out of a couch cushion and the firearm discharged a bullet through the floor of an upstairs room, hitting the female on the first level, patient was taken C2 to St. Mary's

8/4 – I-70/Loma exit – 1 vehicle rollover accident with three passengers, two transported, one fatality; 3245 White Avenue – 41 year old female was transported to St. Mary's, claiming she was stabbed in the abdomen and leg by an unknown subject who broke in to her apartment.

8/7 – 3096 Silver Court – law enforcement was called to address multiple times for fights and verbal disturbances.

8/8 – 2774 Monroe Court – Fight involving multiple family members, RP's 22 year old son in a relationship with a 15 year old female and a fight started between the son and the RP's daughter, a pregnant female was assaulted and injured but left before the ambulance arrived, she came back later and the squad was sent back out and transported her to St. Mary's, one subject fled the scene on foot but was

quickly apprehended, multiple subjects issued summons'; Riverside/Colorado Avenue – drive by shooting reported; suspect was tracked to the Orchard Mesa area where he apprehended at gunpoint and taken in to custody.

8/9 – 923 N 12th Street – 60 year old female found DOA outside after falling down a set of stairs, had been dead for several hours; 28 Road/Canal – unknown aged male found DOA in an empty culvert under the interstate, had been dead for several days, possible suicide; Mesa County Search and Rescue was called out to Bull Basin Reservoir #2 after two ATV riders called in reporting they were lost in the area, RP was given coordinates and the party found their way back to the trail head before SARC arrived.

8/17 – Cold Sore Reservoir – SARC responded to and located a lost hiker in the area, no injuries; Big Creek Reservoir – subjects that were rescued the previous night were attempting to recover their vehicle that was stuck, truck they were using to pull the stuck vehicle got two flat tires, SARC was called out to rescue the party of four and their vehicles; 936 Colorado Avenue – one male found DOA of self-inflicted gunshot wound; Center Town Liquors in Fruita – female was robbed at knifepoint, male subject fled on a bicycle, was located quickly and taken in to custody; 2848 Kennedy Avenue – RP reported that her son had a knife and was attempting to steal her vehicle, he left the address on foot but was apprehended and taken in to custody a short time later; 2680 B ½ Road #26B – RP called to report a possible burglary by a known subject, also reported previous threats by subject and possible felony menacing, law enforcement located the subjects vehicle, unoccupied, no weapons.

8/22 – 62735 E Highway 330 – ATV crash, one patient transported via CareFlight to St. Mary's with unknown injuries; Highway 141/MM 149 – single motorcycle crash, Lands End rescue transported patient to St. Mary's; Bangs Canyon/Highway 141 – SARC called out to find a lost subject on his bicycle.

8/30 – 3051 Colorado Avenue – shots fired, no injuries but several subjects taken in to custody including one runaway.
