

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): Oscar D. Stewart was the first owner of the house, constructed ca. 1901. Carrie and Jesse Stevens, a mail carrier, were the owners/occupants ca. 1905-1918. Kate Shott, widow of Frank, was the owner/co-occupant with Clyde Shott ca. 1922, and the absentee owner ca. 1924-1926. Della Caldwell was the owner ca. 1928-1939, living in the house off and on during the period and renting it out the rest of the time. Eva and Rufus T. Hirons, chief of the drivers license bureau and later a district grazer for the U.S. Grazing Service, owned/resided in the house ca. 1939-1946.
