ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with side gable roof. Exposed concrete foundation. Concrete steps lead up to small gabled portico in center of facade. Sides of portico have wood ribbed balustrades. Porch posts are 4 x 4s and carry elliptical basket handle arches in three sides of the portico. Majority of windows are double hung wood sash, six-over-six. Large fixed pane picture window in east side of facade. Metal storm door. Main door is flush with three small, diagonally arranged lights. Tan wood shake siding. Porch steps, posts, railings, segmental arches, window frames and surrounds, foundation, gutters and downspouts are dark brown. Tan composition shingle roof with eaves close to the wall. Rake boards. Brick chimney in north slope.

Landscaped with lawn, rows of shrubs in front yard, several shrubs, and tall evergreens against facade. Large and small trees in front yard. Backyard enclosed by low chain link fence.

Single car garage in rear with front gable, green composition shingle roof and tan wide clapboard siding.


