


ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with side gables and small front gable. Side entry. Gray concrete front steps and stoop with wrought iron railing lead to paneled front door. Gabled entry wing in the center third of facade with an English flared catslide eave on the east slope. Windows are double hung wood sash, five vertical lights over one. Clapboard siding is peach. Door and window surrounds, rakeboards, steps, stoop and foundation are painted light gray. Louvered window shutters, and narrow trim around rakeboards are turquoise. Gray composition shingle roof. Eaves close to the wall. Brick fireplace chimney on the east gable wall and a brick chimney on the south slope.
 Landscaped with lawn, elm trees, arboreta and smilax by foundation. Locust and ash trees on parking area.
 Garage at rear, ca. 1937, with clapboard siding, side gable roof, paneled entry door, and new aluminum garage door.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (briefly justify the significance checked above): A 1930's adaptation of contemporary clapboard with English entry wing, this house is located in the proposed Merchant/Professional Residential District. Between 1904 and 1940, the city of Grand Junction expanded to the east of the original square mile. Merchants and professionals settled into this area creating a distinctive neighborhood.
