

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One and a half story, with side gables and battered foundation. Full width front porch under principal roof. Broad concrete steps with paneled concrete piers. Porch glazed as sunroom with wood casements and transoms. Siding on porch half-wall. Windows primarily double hung, wood sash, one-over-one. Dormer with shed roof and three single pane windows. False bevel siding in buff; trim around doors, windows and eaves in brown. Green composition shingle roof with knee braces under eaves. Red brick fireplace chimney on east eave wall. Brick chimney on north slope.

Landscaped with concrete retaining wall along sidewalk and large lilacs on lawn. Sumacs on lawn and parking area.
Modified original garage at rear, ca. 1920, with false bevel siding, front gable, and garage doors boarded over.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): Owner/occupants from ca. 1924 to 1940 were John H. and Fern E. Ponsford. Mr. Ponsford was one of three partners listed for Harris Auto Company. The house was purchased by Meda G. Meyeretto, serving for two years as a rental, and acquired in ca. 1942 by William and Genevieve Callahan. Mr. Callahan operated the Callahan Funeral Home.
