

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story, hip roof and battered foundation. English/Norman entry with steep gable and flared eave. Paneled front door is white with leaded and stained glass sidelights. Windows are tall, wood sash, double hung, one-over-one. White wood shake walls with teal trim. Red composition shingle roof with rough, red stucco chimney on north slope.

Landscaped with hedge along east of lawn, tall cedar by door, sycamore in parking area.

Garage at rear, ca. 1936, with clapboard siding, front gable, six light window and original batten door.

THEME(S):

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (briefly justify the significance checked above): This house is an example of various updates. The original structure may have been a Classic Cottage with an English/Norman style entry and wood shake siding added in the 1930s or 1940s. Shake walls and the English/Norman entry look like a remodel in the 1940's mode. Tall windows indicate high ceilings, typical of Victorian houses. This house appears to be much older than the records indicate, suggesting it may have been moved onto the property. Although not eligible for the National Register, this house may contribute to a local register.

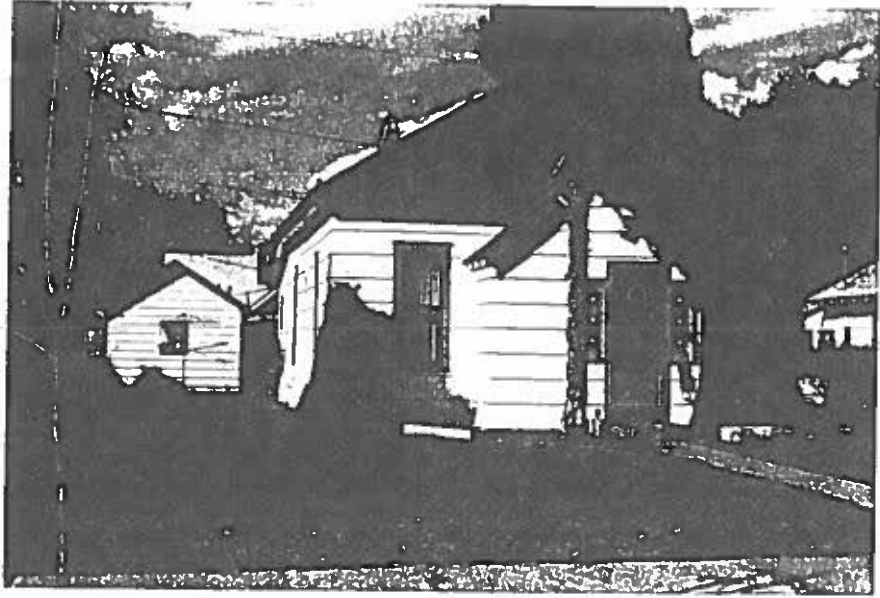
