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

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ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Side gables and concrete block construction. Open porch inset under principal roof on east side of facade. Porch has wood columns, strengthened by angle irons, with deep ornamental geometric incisions. Front door has large single light. Windows are double hung wood sash, one-over-one, with concrete lintels and sills. Shed roof dormer with three single pane windows. Concrete block walls are painted yellow, foundation is painted white. Brown wood shingled gables and green composition shingle roof. Exposed rafter ends. Brick chimney on south slope. Landscaped with clusters of aspens on right and left of front walk. Beds of annuals along walk. Lawn enclosed by white picket fence. Gravel parking area with one ash tree. Garage at rear with clapboard siding, side gable, and double fiberglass garage door.
