Career, while in house (1918-1948?): District Manager of the Colorado Milling and Elevator Company. The company was one of the largest in Western CO with mills in Delta, Montrose and Grand Junction. During his career he introduced the milling of fine wheat & grain to Western CO. He was also a leader in the promotion of mixed feed for poultry & livestock feeding. Organizations: Charter member of Rotary Club and Rotarian of the Year in 1948. He was active in masonic organizations including Mesa Lodge #55, the Scottish Rite, Eastern Star, and the Shriners. He was also a member of the Chamber of Commerce, being an actively promoting the region.
