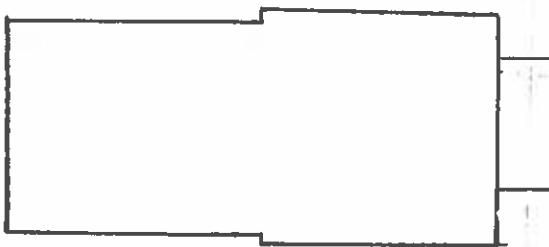

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with hip roof. Foundation is veneered with flagstones. Screened front porch extends three-quarters the width of the facade. Porch has a dropped shed roof and a half wall with small squared columns on each corner. Full height columns flank opening for screen door. Front door is blue, paneled with diamond panes and wood muntins. Windows are tall, double hung, wood sash one-over-one, most of them also have aluminum storm windows. White simple drop siding with white trim. Roofed with composition shingles of various colors on various slopes. Decayed brick chimney on ridge.

Picket fence surrounds lawn. Landscaped with lawn, small locust and medium sized globe willow on front lawn.
Corrugated aluminum shed and small wood shed in rear.

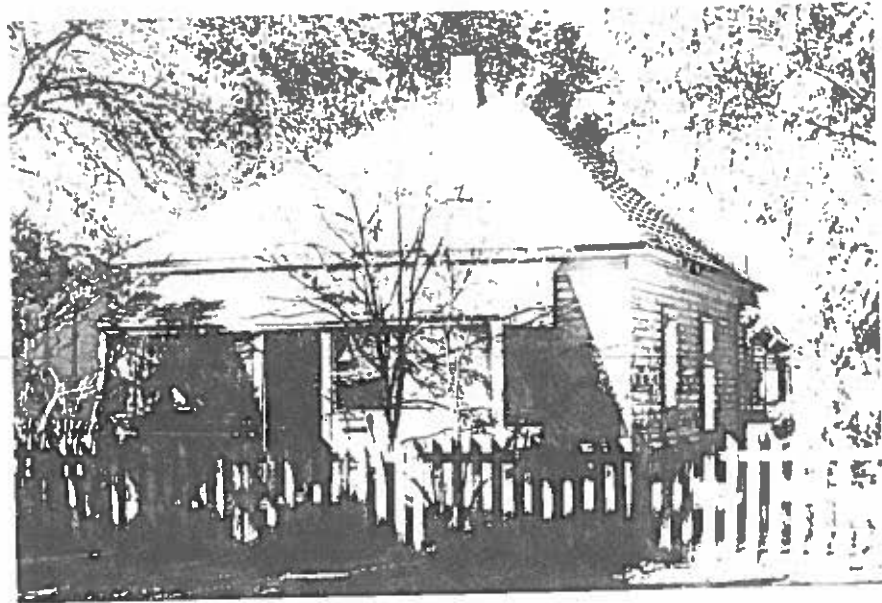
