ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with side hip on gable roof. Foundation skirted with shingles. Wood steps lead up to small gabled portico over porch, supported with knee braces. Paneled front door with three vertical lights. French doors on east elevation with wood steps. Screen doors. Windows are double hung wood sash, five vertical lights over one. Glazed back porch has wood casements with nine lights. Buff false bevel siding with brown window and door surrounds, barge boards, knee braces, wood steps, porch and foundation shingles. White trim on window frames and muntins, screen doors. Brown composition shingle roof.

Landscaped lawn with curving front walk. Three large arborvitae across facade. Globe willow on west lawn. Locusts, elms and mulberries around house. Plank fence around lawn, with planting beds of annuals on east lawn.

Garage at rear with front hip on gable roof, false bevel siding, and batten doors.

CONSTRUCTION HISTORY (include description and dates of major additions, alterations, or demolitions): Foundation was rebuilt in 1974, original foundation material unknown. Storm windows.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): Orchard Mesa is a triangle of desert land between the Gunnison and Colorado Rivers and the Grand Mesa. By 1890, orchards were planted by homesteaders as they settled into the area. Today, the orchards are receding under the pressure of subdivisions.

Constructed ca. 1926, this house, was owned by Glen and Roberta Perkins from ca. 1926-1946. Mr. Perkins was a clerk at Loeffiers who later became a department manager at Brownson's in 1946. Through the early 1950s it is difficult to determine where residents lived on Orchard Mesa as numbered street addresses did not appear in the Grand Junction City Directories with any regularity. Grand Junction did not begin to annex Orchard Mesa into the City until 1966.


