

Three doors along facade. The door to #418 is contemporary, flush with a large light. The door to #420 is paneled with a large light, and may be original to the building. Immediately to the north of the #420 door is an unnumbered flush contemporary door. There are two large show windows on the facade, and two on the north elevation. On the south end of facade is a small picture window. The second floor has double hung, wood sash windows, one-over-one on facade and south elevation.
