ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with side hip on gables. Foundation skirted with siding. Concrete steps lead up to terrace extending across center half of facade. Concrete half-walls of terrace rise from ground level. In center of facade, gabled portico, with raking and return cornices, has curved ceiling and large knee braces. Gabled sunporch wing on east one-third of facade. Ribbons of windows on three sides are double hung wood sash, one-over-one. Front door is flush and has four narrow vertical lights. Windows around house are mostly double hung wood sash, one-over-one. On west side of facade is a ribbon of three windows. Large center window in transom. Plank shutters on several windows. Gray false bevel siding with gray trim. Door, shutters and terrace coping are salmon. Light green composition shingle roof. Roof bargeboards have long, rounded ends. Concrete chimney on north slope. Landscaped with lawn, spirea, and large evergreens and pyracantha. Ash trees in parking. Two car carport attached to north elevation.


