

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with front gable roof. Concrete foundation is skirted. Concrete stoop with wrought iron railings covered by gabled canopy with knee braces. Paneled front door is metal. Windows around house are pairs of single light, metal frame sliding windows. Beige clapboard siding. Door frame, canopy knee braces, window surrounds and raking cornices are dark red. Tan metal ridge roof. Eaves close to the wall. Brick chimney on south slope. Arched, wood louvered opening in gable.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): Built ca. 1949, this is the latest addition to a court of seven cottages which also includes: 120 S. 11th Street, 1104 Colorado, 1122 Colorado, 1114 Colorado, 1110 Colorado and 1118 Colorado. In 1949, Molly Dean and Paul Stucker, chemical analyst, were the tenants. Owner Helen Reed resided in the building ca. 1951. Eileen and Dale Smith, salesman, were the tenants in 1955.
