ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with hip roof with cross gables. Concrete block foundation. Concrete steps lead up to porch with hip roof extending across west half of facade. Four squared, full length columns placed along porch. Porch half-wall of siding. Front door is paneled with large light. Windows are double hung wood sash, one-over-one. Window on front wing is transom. Cutaway bay on west elevation has pedimented gable. White simple drop siding with gray window and door surrounds, columns and cornices. Foundation is white. Light green composition shingle roof. Sables on north and west slopes are pedimented with kick. Each has a circular louvered vent.
