ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with front gable. Battered foundation. Concrete steps with wrought iron railings lead up to gabled sunporch/entry on west half of facade. Siding on half-wall and square half length columns on front corners of porch. Porch is glazed with large lights in metal frames. Storm door. Paneled front door has three vertical lights.
