

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One story with cross gables. Battered foundation. Concrete steps enter from the side, with cobblestone pier and pipe				
railing, lead up to screened front porch which extends across center half of facade. Gable over front porch has Craftsman elements. Half-wall of cobblestone has concrete coping. A squared half column is placed toward ends of half wall. Screen door. Front door is flush with a diamond light. Windows are double hung wood sash, one-over-one and metal framed single light sliding windows. Gable face has staggered wood shingles. Top third of gable has a lattice ventilation screen filling the apex. White false bevel siding and white trim. Gray windows surrounds. Light gray composition shingle roof with deep eaves and rafter beams. White painted brick chimney on south slope. House is set toward back of lot with large front lawn. Tall roses and a birdbath along facade and a tall hedge along sidewalk. Elm and ash trees along east lawn. Gravel in parking area. Side gable wing on the west elevation provides space for a one car garage. Same false bevel siding as house, gray composition shingle roof, and paneled three section folding door with four lights per section.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (discuss important persons and events associated with this building): The first residents of the house, constructed ca. 1910, were Eleanor and E. Frank Winfield who owned a music store and a stationery store. They resided in the house ca. 1915-1930, with the exception of ca. 1928, when the tenants were Henrietta and A. Wayne Luellen, chief clerk for the Public Service Company of Colorado. Doris and A.W. Theelin, a partsman, were the owners/residents ca. 1931-1957.
